April Meeting Recap

The meeting opened with the announcement of the death of **Leoma Lovegrove**, artist and Gulf Coast Writers benefactor (see article below). A condolence card was available for members to sign.

Our new, regular meeting location is **St. Hilary's Episcopal Church**, 5011 McGregor Blvd. in Fort Myers at the foot of the Midpoint Bridge.

Flyers were distributed and attendees were asked to share or post flyers at community clubhouses, churches or temples, with book club friends, and others, inviting them to come on the writing journey and join GCWA.

Raffle tickets were sold for one admission to the virtual <u>15th</u> <u>Annual Nonfiction Writers Conference</u> May 7-8. The event is sponsored by the Nonfiction Authors Association. New GCWA member, Suzanne Willis, won the raffle which garnered \$95 toward the GCWA 30th Anniversary celebration November 8.

Arthur Wenk, whose publications include prestigious academic works on music history, bibliography, and choral conducting and photography and western culture. He authored a series of murder mystery novellas with musicologist Axel Crochet as sleuth. He spoke about his writing journey, from academia to his novellas, reading several passages. He holds a doctorate and three master's degrees and is now taking a hiatus from writing to focus on a four-year theology program. He advised aspiring and established writers to "never give up."

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Win The Micro-Moments To Maximize AttentionBy David Kratzke

Distractions are everywhere. It's likely your family, friends, or colleagues aren't even listening to you because they're busy checking incoming beeps on their phones.

According to Microsoft research from 2013, average attention spans have dropped to eight seconds. That's shorter than a goldfish, clocking in at nine seconds. With increasingly less time to make an impact, how can you serve up messages that resonate with your target audience?

Learn To Love Impressions

Much like Real Estate is about location, Marketing is about frequency.

Everyone wants to count the likes, shares, follows, comments, and clicks. Strong click-through rates and healthy engagement are critical, but you can't generate those results without a high frequency of impressions that impact your audience.

An impression is recorded when your digital ad or shared content appears on someone's screen. Impressions build your brand identity and expand your company's digital footprint. More impressions equate to reaching a larger audience and ultimately creating the opportunity for more prospects to click and ultimately buy your book or read your piece!

Win The Micro-Moments

Micro-moments are those slivers of time when you are multitasking. For example, when a commercial during a football game piques your interest, you look up that product on your phone from the couch. Or when you click a recipe while you're cooking that meal.

Be Top-Of-Mind At Decision Time

For instance, "decision time" could be conducting research at a store before making a purchase.

The ideas above all offer opportunities to engage customers and to help build a strong brand image. If you've effectively leveraged your impressions and won your fair share of micro-moments, then book sales and fans will follow as you and your writings are searched before even considering bestselling new releases.



Leoma Lovegrave Passes

Beloved Lee County artist <u>Leoma Lovegrove</u> passed away April 10, 2025 at age 72. Leoma lived her life as a "work of art," as a Pine Island artist known for her colorful, whimsical paintings. Leoma had <u>just opened her new gallery in downtown Fort Myers in November 2024.</u> Her previous gallery in Matlacha was badly damaged by Hurricane Ian but had reopened before the move to Fort Myers.

When Jeanne Meeks first heard of Leoma's losses, Jeanne asked her to write her story for the "Storm Stories" collection. Leoma shared her personal story of devastation in "Masterpieces from the Muck." It was Leoma's drive, "Ever Forward," that motivated new artwork, that was displayed at the Alliance for the Arts book launch for "Storm Stories – Hurricane lan". The internationally known artist created and donated the book's cover artwork in her unique and colorful style. Although she did reopen her island gallery after repairs, Leoma opened her new gallery in downtown Fort Myers in November 2024, with GCWA members in attendance. Leoma was the largest purchaser/reseller of "Storm Stories" books. She ordered and sold through her gallery well over a hundred copies. She was a great supporter of GCWA. She will be missed.
